The origin of the blessing of bread on St. Anthony's day began with a child of Padua, who fell into a barrel of water, and was drowned. The grieving mother called on St. Anthony promising that she would donate the child's weight in grain for the poor if the child were restored to life. While the mother was still praying, the child arose as if from sleep. This miracle gave rise to the pious practice of giving alms to the poor as a petition or in return for favors received through St. Anthony's intercession. Later, a pious girl named Louise Bouffier at Toulon in France, promised loaves of bread for the poor in exchange for St. Anthony's help. Her shop later became a center of devotion to the Saint; from it the alms of those whose favors were heard were given to the numerous poor families of the city.

The Blessing of Bread: Lord Jesus Christ, bread of angels, living bread for everlasting life, bless + this bread as thou once blessed the five loaves in the wilderness; so that all who eat it reverently may thereby obtain the health they desire for body and soul, Who livest and reignest forever and ever. Amen.

The Origin of the blessing of Lilies: As a young boy, Anthony was kneeling one day at the shrine of Our Lady in the cathedral, his eyes on the tabernacle wherein the Blessed Sacrament was veiled, a demon, one of those baleful spirits that still tempt and delude the unwary, appeared before him. Startled, Anthony traced upon the marble step where he was kneeling the Sign of the Cross. The vision vanished, but the sacred symbol can still be seen indelibly impressed in the marble. Thus are lilies, symbol of purity, connected with the pure St. Anthony.

The Blessing of Lilies: Let us pray. God, the Creator and Preserver of the human race, the Lover of holy purity, the Giver of supernatural grace, and the Dispenser of everlasting salvation; bless + these lilies which we, Thy humble servants, present to Thee today as an act of thanksgiving and in honor of St. Anthony, Thy confessor, and with a request for Thy blessing. Pour out on them, by the saving sign + of the holy cross, Thy dew from on high. Thou in Thy great kindness hast given them to man, and endowed them with a sweet fragrance to lighten the burden of the sick. Therefore, let them be filled with such power that, whether they are used by the sick, or kept in homes or other places, or devoutly carried on one's person, they may serve to drive out evil spirits, safeguard holy chastity, and turn away illness-all this through the prayers of St. Anthony-and finally impart to Thy servants grace and peace; through Christ our Lord. We beg Thee, O Lord, that Thy people may be helped by the constant and devout intercession of Blessed Anthony, Thy illustrious confessor. May he assist us to be worthy of Thy grace in this life, and to attain everlasting joys in the life to come; through Christ our Lord.
