<u>ALL SAINTS' DAY:</u> Nov. 1st is a Holy Day of Obligation. Attendance at Holy Mass and avoidance of unnecessary servile work is obligatory.

POOR SOULS REMEMBRANCE: envelopes are available in the back of church. Please list all the deceased souls that you wish to pray for in or on the envelope, then give it to one of the Sisters, Father or the servers to be placed upon the altar for remembrance at all Masses offered during the month of November.

ALL SOULS DAY, NOV. 2: There will be three Masses for the Poor Souls. "Toties Quoties" -From noon on November 1st to midnight on November 2nd, the Catholic faithful, as often as they visit a church to pray for the faithful departed, and recite six times during each visit the Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be for the intentions of the Church, may gain a plenary indulgence applicable only to the souls in Purgatory, under the usual conditions of: 1.) Confession (within a week before or after) 2.) Holy Communion (within the day before or up to a week after). This plenary indulgence may also be gained from noon on the following Saturday to midnight on the following Sunday, but only by those who did not gain it on November 1st or 2nd.

<u>VISITS TO THE CEMETERY:</u> A plenary indulgence can be gained for the Poor Souls from Nov. 1st through Nov. 8th on each day that you visit a cemetery and pray any vocal or mental prayer. A further plenary indulgence can be gained for continuing to make visits throughout the month of November if at least 15 visits are made.

FIRST FRIDAY and FIRST SATURDAY MASS: in reparation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary are this week. Please sign up for the all night adoration on the Google sheets link that has been sent out. All the hours must be filled in order for us to have this privilege! Devotions for First Saturday will begin at 8:00am; these include the Rosary with meditations and prayers to the Immaculate Heart.

The Catholic Teaching on Indulgences

All the sins we have committed, and which have been forgiven, must be sufficiently expiated, either in this life or in Purgatory. An indulgence is the remission granted by the Church of the temporal punishment due to sins already forgiven. It stems from the power given by Our Lord to St. Peter, the first Pope, and to all his successors: "And I will give thee the keys of the kingdom of heaven; and whatever thou shalt bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever thou shalt loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven" (Matthew 16:19). A *plenary* indulgence is the remission of ALL the

temporal punishment due to our sins. A partial indulgence is the remission of PART of the temporal punishment due to our sins. By means of indulgences, the Church applies to us from her spiritual treasury part of the infinite satisfaction of Jesus Christ and of the superabundant satisfaction of the Blessed Virgin Mary and of the saints. To gain an indulgence for ourselves we must: 1.) be in the state of grace 2.) have at least a general intention of gaining the indulgence 3.) perform the works required by the Church (in the case of prayers, be sure to move your lips; ordinarily, a purely internal prayer will not gain the indulgence). We cannot gain indulgences for other living persons, but we can gain them for the souls in Purgatory, since the Church makes most indulgences applicable to them.
